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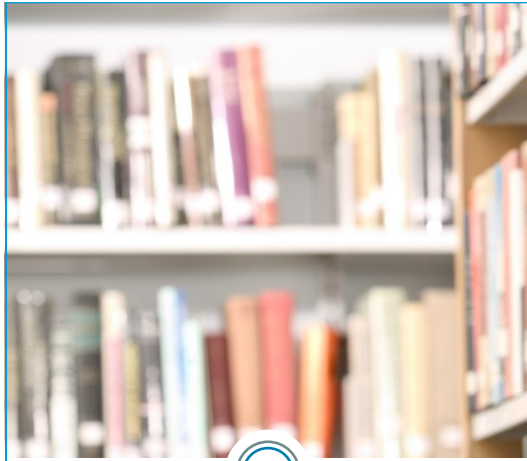

## WHAT IS A GOVERNING BOARD

A governing board is a representative body established in each school and centre according to the Education Act.

In the youth sector it is composed of parents, teachers, representatives or both non-teaching professionals and support staff, day care, and community representatives who work in partnership to ensure that all students receive the best possible learning opportunities.

The school principal/centre director attends governing board meetings but is not a member and is not entitled to vote.

## COMPOSITION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF FES

The governing board at Franklin Elementary School is composed of 4 parents, 2 teachers, and 2 other staff, and 2 community reps.

There are three seats available for election.

- Seat 1: two year term
- Seat 2: two year term

## POWERS AND FUNCTIONS OF A GOVERNING BOARD

The governing board exists to govern the school/centre, not to administer the daily operation thereof. The latter is the responsibility of the principal/centre director. The powers and functions of the governing board impart responsibilities and decisional authority in general matters of school/centre governance as well as matters such as educational services, community services, and physical and financial resources. The power and functions of the governing board are outlined in the Education Act.

## PARENT PARTICIPATION ORGANIZATION (PPO)

The PPO give the opportunity to a larger number of parents to be more directly involved in the life of a school. Its purpose is:
